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What is PBIS?

PBIS stands for Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support. PBIS is a behavior system that aims to build



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effective environments in which positive behavior is more effective than problem behavior. It is a collaborative, assessment-based approach that develops effective interventions for problem behavior.

This support program emphasizes the use of preventative teaching and reinforcement-based strategies to achieve meaningful and durable behavior and

lifestyle outcomes. Through PBIS in all settings, staff and students have consistent expectations. This helps to unify the campus to a centralized goal.

Expectations

Reward and Recognition Program

All students and staff participate in the reward program. The goal of the program is to recognize those students who are “Being REAL”. Teachers and staff distribute tickets to any students that are caught “Being REAL”. The teacher’s name is printed on the ticket and he/she will circle R, E, A, or L depending upon which expectation the student was displaying. The ticket is then given to the student to sign and hold on to. Throughout the school year, the students will be able to use their tickets to shop at the “Be REAL”
